# **Letter from the President**

Now that summer is here, I routinely am asked if the school "shuts down" for a well-deserved break. Actually, summers are just about as busy as the rest of the year. Summer is when we prepare for the upcoming school year. Updates and renovations are made to the campus and buildings, new teachers/staff/coaches are hired, academics are solidified and policies/procedures are updated. This year summer sports are running a little longer than usual because our girls soccer team is preparing for state competition on June 3 and 4. The campus is also busy with Summer Camps and those who are taking advantage of the Wellness Center. We are also preparing for the Fireworks Extravaganza (June 30, Thursday) and the annual golf tournament (July 29, Friday).

Over the last few years, we have learned how important it is to provide in-person learning. This continued commitment is evidenced by the results of three key indicators, ACT scores, High School Placement Test by Scholastic and Scholastic Reading Inventory. The Class of 2022 had 63 graduates and 3 international students. One quarter of the class had a GPA over 4.0, all but one are going to college and/or the military. The combined class received \$1.96M in accepted scholarships and the average ACT was a 22.4 (Top 50%: 26.1 - Top 25%: 27.8 - Top 10%: 30.6). To further confirm our success, we recently received a high score of 365 out of a possible 400 on our accreditation review from COGNIA. Over the last five years, COGNIA's average score awarded to schools is 283.

As we look to the future, we fully embrace the mission of balancing funding with the need to update St. Pius X High School – academically, spiritually, and physically. We are optimistic that the 4 acre tract of land in front of the school will become part of our campus in the near future. We are also creating a Media Production Room and a Student Support Center that will benefit our students this coming school year.

As always, we will continue to stay focused on our primary mission...providing extraordinary Catholic education to all that seek it at St. Pius X High School.

# **Spring Sports Recap**

#### Baseball

The St. Pius X Varsity baseball team finished the year 20-7, this is the only baseball team in St. Pius X history that has won 20 games in a season. The team won the 2022 JCAA Conference Championship and was the Class 3 District 3 Champions. Seven seniors, Kyle Lewis, Collin Brown, Michael Argana, Tate Ramey, Nathan Stoll, Nathan Schwer, and Austin Almany led the Lancers this season. The baseball team was fortunate enough to play once again at GCS (Minor League stadium in Sauget, IL) and Busch Stadium, the home of the St. Louis Cardinals. This season the Lancers welcomed former Major League player and St. Pius X alumni Mike Henneman (Class of 1980) back and retired his #18 jersey. The baseball coaches would like to thank all the parents, players, and administration for their support this season.

#### Golf

While the St. Pius X golf team had its unforeseen share of difficulties this season, the end result would definitely be considered successful. The overall record for the team was 7-7, which included a 6-3 record in conference. Two Lancer golfers (Will Becker and Jack O'Connor) earned All-Conference Honors, and for the first time since 2018, multiple individuals (Will and Connor Isenman) qualified for the State Championship Tournament. With the new home of the Lancer golfers being at Crystal Highlands Golf Course, we were able to host our first high school golf tournament, a huge milestone for the program.

# **Track and Field**

This year has been a great year for the St. Pius X Track team. We had the largest turnout since the mid-1990s. The athletes all worked hard and it was evident because we had 18 athletes place in the top four in Districts and move on to sectional. The team then had 8 athletes compete in the Class 2 State Track meet in Jefferson City.
