Mr. Ralph Boyer



Athletic Director, teacher, basketball and baseball coach Ralph Boyer passed away January 14 th at 86 years of age. Ralph started his longtime coaching career in 1959 with the founding of St. Pius X High School in Festus, and continued working at St. Pius X as a teacher, coach and athletic director until his retirement in 1998.

Mr. Boyer dedicated his teaching vocation to St. Pius X. Many of his former players and students attended the wake of Mr. Boyer. There was much joy in the memory of his life and his legacy, but particularly as it applied to his coaching. The wake was a great tribute to his life.

The conversation at the funeral home moved to basketball and baseball. A number of Mr. Boyer's athletes wanted to get to a home game for the current St. Pius X team. This evolved into an informal gathering at the St. Pius X boys basketball game on February 4. His memory was commemorated with a short prayer before the game in the gym that bears his name. Following the game a reception was attended by former players in the school cafeteria. Two of his children, Robert Boyer '82 and Liz (Boyer '80) Rothweiler were part of the memory trip. Ralph would have been pleased. Thank you Mr. Boyer for 39 years of your life.

Faculty Focus: Marty Zielonko



Marty Zielonko started at St. Pius X High School as an English teacher, Freshmen/JV assistant football coach and freshmen basketball coach in the 1977/78 school year. Around 1980 Fr. Dalton asked him to become the Coordinator of Disciples (which was not a paid gig at the time). This position title was eventually changed to Dean of Students. In 1982, with the approval and support of Fr. Dalton the Drug Ed class began at St. Pius X High School. It began as one-quarter of junior year Religion. After many years as an English teacher, he gave it up to focus solely on his position as Dean of Students and his Drug Education class. After spending 20 years as Dean of Students, Marty transitioned to the role of College Counselor. Now semi-retired he returns to campus to "just do drugs". Drug Education is a semester credit class meeting every other day for the entire year. The junior-level students take this via the Wellness Department and it is required for graduation. They write 7 papers, take tests and every drug category and hundreds of drug issues are covered. Nothing is taboo. They spend three months covering Addiction alone! This is the 36th year the class has been offered, and we believe this is the only class of its kind in the entire United States.

Virtual Learning



St. Pius X High School will be closed to students from March 18 through April 3 to minimize potential student and faculty exposure to the Covid-19 virus.

In anticipation of this closure, St. Pius X faculty and staff have been preparing for an extended period of virtual learning for their nearly 300 students. Faculty meetings and training took place on March 17 and 18. Students will start receiving lessons and assignments on Thursday, March 19 via tools such as Google's G-Suite.

"These unprecedented circumstances do not mean we cannot continue to educate our students," Principal Karen DeCosty said. "We gained valuable experience with eLearning on a couple of snow days earlier this year, giving our faculty and administration the confidence to implement a longer-term solution via technology while we fight off this virus."

Virtual learning at St. Pius X is much more involved than sending packets of worksheets home with students. Teachers, working from home or on campus, will be using various educational and technological tools to both deliver content to the students and encourage collaboration to complement the student's virtual learning environment. Faculty members will have "office hours" during which students can reach out to them with questions about assignments.

"While it is no replacement for in-person interaction with faculty, this is the best solution for the situation we are in," said DeCosty, who has been the St. Pius X principal for 13 years. "We have an obligation to our students and families to do everything possible to provide them with a high level of education they have come to expect from our school."

St. Pius X is scheduled to reopen to students on Monday, April 6. Any changes to that date will be published on www.stpius.com.
