Letter from the President

On behalf of the St. Pius X High School community, we hope you and your loved ones are well. At St. Pius X High School, we strive to provide our students with a vibrant, Catholic, Christ-centered education delivered within a caring, supportive community.

St. Pius X High School has been serving our community by providing an extraordinary education since we opened the doors in 1959. Our school's purpose is clearly defined in our mission statement:

St. Pius X High School is a Catholic community dedicated to the education of the whole person, in an environment where extraordinary care and concern for the individual is ordinary. Catholic Education is our mission, and we will continue to serve this mission to help form the future leaders of America.

Recently, we've seen firsthand just how important this school and faith community are to our students and their families and we are only further energized in our pursuit of this goal. On Friday, January 21 we completed our accreditation process through Cognia. We are happy to share that the preliminary findings confirm that we are doing what our mission calls us to do – successfully providing an exceptional and vibrant Catholic education for our students. In addition to providing our students with extraordinary academics, we are exceeding our students' spiritual, emotional, and physical needs. We will be able to officially share the findings once we receive the final report.

A recent article in the Leader, <u>Jefferson County students' MAP scores dip during pandemic</u>, highlighted the decline in test scores in our county as a result of the pandemic. The below chart summarizes those results.

Being a non-public school, St. Pius X is not allowed to take part in the state testing program Missouri's public schools administer. However, we use three different types of data to measure our students to track their growth.

First, and most common, is the ACT. Each year St. Pius X administers a practice ACT to all freshmen, sophomores and juniors. Not only does this help them gain familiarity with the test it also helps them track their progress and focus on the areas they need to focus on. St. Pius X uses this information to help behind the scenes with curriculum and lesson planning. Most people look at the scores and not the meaning behind them. Since ACT is technically designed to be a predictor of college success we focus on the college readiness benchmarks. Below is how the class of 2021 performed their freshman year vs senior year on the ACT. While we cannot control the academic level of our students when they begin at St. Pius X, we can make sure each student grows during their time.

Second, and newer to St. Pius X and the St. Louis Archdiocesan schools, is the High School Placement Test by Scholastic. This test began being used with the Class of 2024. The Archdiocese has asked our schools to administer this test when they are 8th graders once they are accepted into St. Pius X and again in the spring of their freshman year. As you can see in the graph below, the average score in each area improved while they were here as a freshman.

Finally there is the Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI). This measures a student's Lexile which is a way to gauge a student's reading level. St. Pius X uses this as a way to track how our students are reading and for teachers to know which students struggle with reading. Below is how the Class of 2021 began and ended their time at St. Pius X.

Boys Basketball

The St. Pius X Boys Basketball season came to an end on Friday, February 25th, in a 34-42 loss to Carnahan High School. While losing in the district semifinals cut the journey short, the Lancers had nothing to hang their heads about when looking back on their 2021-2022 basketball season. They finished with an overall record of 18-9. It was only the 7th time in school history that a St. Pius X Boys Basketball team had won 18 or more games in a season. The Lancers also finished the season with a perfect 5-0 record in the JCAA Small Schools Conference, which gave them the outright conference championship for the first time since 2016. Although the program loses seven seniors to graduation, they have laid a strong foundation for all returning and future basketball players.

Girls Basketball

Lady Lancers (16-9) won their first district title since the 2010 season when Assistant Coach Tori Aubuchon was a senior in high school. This is one the best defensive teams in the St. Louis area only allowing 32 points a game from their opponents. The girls are very coachable and compete at the highest level. It has been an extremely enjoyable season.

Boys Wrestling

Our Dual record was 6-15 and we finished ninth of 16 teams at Districts. We had two state qualifiers, Jonny Halfmann and Andrew Boldt. The team had the following wins; Brentwood, Cape Notre Dame, Affton, Borgia, Lift for Life Academy, and St. Clair. Took 9th at Districts. A great start for the first year of this program.

Girls Wrestling

The first Girls wrestling season went very well. We had 6 girls and 5 competed throughout the season. The team's dual record was 8 wins and 7 losses. Senior Captain Maddie Birkenmeier led the team. Freshman Ava Gilbreth and Sophomore Jillian Grissom both came within one match of qualifying for State. Team wins, two against Affton, Herky, Festus, Cape Notre Dame, Hancock, Lift for Life, and Potosi.

Spring Outlook

Girls Soccer

We only lost two senior starters. Finishing last year as the district runner up. There is some really skilled freshman coming in. This year's team should have the experience and skill to once again compete for that district championship.

Baseball

Coming off a 10 - 12 season that saw the Lancers finish 2nd in the R-7 Tournament, 2nd in the JCAA Small Conference, and 2nd in Class 3 District 4 playoffs, the Lancers look to come into 2022 focused on improving all those finishes. The Lancers return their top two pitchers from 2021 (Senior Tate Ramey who has committed to Fontbonne, and Sophomore Zander Street) as well as other pitchers (Andrew Merseal, Nathan Stoll, Colin Brown, & Nathan Schwer). The Lancers return eight starters from last season including Jefferson College commit catcher Austin Almany, Michael Argana, and several other varsity returnees including (Bryce Schrader, Jacob Messmer). Others who could contribute at the Varsity level this season include Connor Hamilton, James Smith, Jordan Sanders, Keaton Held, Kirk Ewy, Scott Engelskind, and Ty Ortmann. This season the Lancers will have two featured games on the schedule at Busch Stadium on April 9, and GCS Stadium on May 12. The Lancers will open the 2022 season at the Jefferson R-7 Tournament on March 18 - 19.

Golf

This year, the golf team has the potential to live up to the legacy of the 2018 group, who was the first team in school history to go to the State Championship Tournament. We have a very young, dedicated group of returning players who worked hard over the summer to improve every aspect of their game, and there are promising freshman players who have the ability to improve and better our program. We have faith for a successful season as our seniors finish their high school careers and our underclassmen begin to take over leadership roles in the program.

Track and Field

We are looking forward to a good spring 2022 Season. We welcome new coach RJ Eberhart who will assist with the throwing events. Coach John Daly will continue with our distance crew and Coach Therese Ruble will be working with Sprinters/Jumpers/Hurdlers. We have five senior boys and two senior girls to lead our young roster. We look for big things from our two returning State Qualifiers, senior Nate Ruble (thrower) and junior Hanna Burch (thrower).

Boys Tennis

This season the boys tennis team features a lot of players proving their skills from other sports can translate to tennis. Having graduated the majority of the team last year, a whole new crop of athletes carry on the tennis tradition for St. Pius. The new team consists of two basketball players, two soccer players, a handful of wrestlers, and a saxophone player.

Boys Volleyball

The first ever boys volleyball team at St. Pius X (an emerging sport through MSHSAA) has been established and the season has started. The boys are dedicated to their other teammates, coaches, and the program as a whole. With everyone's hard work at practice, the team is

confident that there will be success on the court. The coaches and managers are extremely impressed with the progress that has been made and the outstanding teamwork that has been displayed. Games start off on Saturday March 19th at Seckman High School in a JV tournament with a plethora of different teams and skill levels.
