A Glimpse Inside our Geneva Summer Program

The Webster Department of Dance students experienced a one-of-a-kind study abroad opportunity this summer in Geneva, Switzerland. In collaboration with Webster Geneva and Conservatoire populaire de musique, danse et théâtre in Geneva, nine of our students spent eight weeks studying European Contemporary Dance. This new program featured five different international instructors including Webster University alumnus Ramon Moraes and previous Royal Ballet company dancer, Estelle Bovay.

In addition to their dance classes, the students were exposed to the Geneva arts scene and encouraged to explore throughout Europe on the weekends. "It was an enjoyable experience with lots of lessons learned and amazing new relationships with people I met. Thailand which will be offered in Summer 2019.






Dance Department September Events

The second Annual Festival will take place on September 8, 2018, with a full day of performances, workshops, demonstrations, and informational booths in Grand Center.

The Festival's founder and Webster alumna, Paige Walden Johnson, recently had this to say, "After graduating from Webster, I dabbled in performing, choreographing, and managing with local dance companies. It wasn't until Rain Stippec's terrible encounter with gun violence, that I knew how to focus what I gained from my training at Webster. Art is a powerful catalyst for change through communication, education, and healing. CommUNITY Arts Festival is a way for me to share what I have to offer as an artist to aid the Saint Louis community."
