A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

TO THE LANCER FAMILY,

Founded in 1959, St. Pius X High School is a co-ed, four-year, college preparatory school. Our school includes a community of 300+ students and a staff of caring teachers, staff and administrators. We serve both Catholic and non-Catholic students by providing an up-to-date curriculum that meets today's expanding standards in academics.

At the start of our next fiscal year, July 1, 2023, we are happy to announce that our school will be legally named St. Pius X Catholic High School. Prior to this change, we were incorporated as a legal entity under the collective name "Catholic High School Association of St. Louis" along with other Archdiocesan high schools. We are transitioning from an Archdiocesan-owned high school to a newly formed, separately incorporated 501c3 entity. We will have a Board of Limited Jurisdiction consisting of a group of Directors. These Directors will have delegated authority to make local-level policy decisions related to a specified set of areas encompassing Catholicity and mission, strategic planning, finance, academic affairs, student programming, marketing and enrollment management, advancement, and certain areas related to facilities management.

The Archbishop will become what is referred to as the sole Member within the governance structure and will hold reserved powers at each high school for ultimate oversight of Catholicity and decision-making regarding the appointed president, board member approval, amendments to the by-laws, financial systems, and property. St. Pius X Catholic High School will enter into agreements with the Archdiocese for services pertaining to human resources, legal, and buildings and real estate. Insurance and retirement programs will remain in place.

We are excited and invigorated by this change as we anticipate a greater sense of empowerment and ownership of our school. Given our faith formation, academic excellence and dedication to providing extraordinary care and concern, we are confident that St. Pius X Catholic High School will continue to be successful.

Please continue to pray for our St. Pius X school and community.




CLASS OF 2023



St. Pius X High School recently graduated 75 students in its 2023 class. 93% of the class will be enrolling in college in the fall or enlisting in the military. 70 students will be attending 27 different colleges in 7 states, with 1 senior enlisting in the United States Air Force.

- 25 (33%) attending a two-year / technical college
- 41 (55%) attending a four-year college / university
- 3 (4%) are attending a technical / trade school

ACADEMICS

St. Pius X continues to see growth among our students academically!


In the fall of 2022 St. Pius X was named a School of Distinction by Cognia following an accreditation review in January of 2022. This is a prestigious award earned by only three schools in Missouri and only 96 schools globally. This is a true testament to our mission and dedication to continuously improving our school in all areas...Catholicity, academics, athletics and environment.


St. Pius X High School was established in 1959 to provide a Catholic education in Jefferson County and beyond. Catholicism is the largest layer of our foundation followed by academics. It has always been our mission to provide the best education possible. We take students in from various schools and at various learning abilities, and we challenge them to grow academically to be ready for life after high school.

Measuring growth can be tricky. Teachers see it everyday in the classroom throughout the year. Finding a way to quantify that growth as a school looks different. St. Pius X uses a practice ACT to track this growth from year to year. The ACT is a standardized test used for college admissions in the United States. It is currently administered by ACT, a nonprofit organization of the same name. The ACT test covers four academic skill areas: english, mathematics, reading, and scientific reasoning.

Media sources have published information about the impact of COVID on school/student performance. Recent data is showing a decline in enrollment in public schools in Jefferson County. I am proud to say that we have not only seen an increase in enrollment, but we've also been able to maintain our success with student growth. Below is data showing the student growth from year to year. There are some national trends to consider while looking at these:

- 1. Freshmen are asked to take the ACT. This is a challenge as many are still developing their skills and many have only had exposure to Algebra I.
- 2. There is a national trend showing students are not the readers they once were. We work very hard on developing stronger readers but we too see this trend.
- 3. Mathematical foundations are weaker than prior to 2020. The lack of instruction students received from March 2020 through May 2021 has created gaps in many students' education. Math seems to be the worst. Traditionally math scores are the lowest of all areas but the skills they should know when entering high school have declined.





(National Averages for 2022 were: English (19.8), English (19), Math (19.3) and Reading (20.4) (66% of students in Missouri took the ACT while 96% of students at St. Pius X took the ACT)

We also track the percentage of students who are meeting the ACT College Readiness Benchmarks. These are the scores ACT has chosen to determine when a student has demonstrated the skills needed to be successful in college. Below you will see the classes of 2022 and 2023 and how they performed year to year. When looking at their freshman year you can see the trends mentioned above. Math and Reading has dropped and Math still remains the lowest.

583 program

It has been an exciting 2022-23 school year regarding our 583 Program. Our innovative 583 program is our college visit initiative in which we take 5 college trips to 8 different schools in a student's first 3 years of high school. This school year, our juniors took trips to Southeast Missouri State University, Maryville University, and the University of Missouri at St. Louis (UMSL). Our sophomores took visits to Saint Louis University, McKendree University, Maryville University, and Lindenwood University. Our freshman students began their 583 journey this year by taking a trip to Jefferson College in the spring.

This school year introduced a new element to our 583 program as we took students that are interested in the trades to some technical schools and to visit a local industry. In September, we took a group of seniors for a tour of Ranken Tech in St. Louis. In April, a group of junior students were given the opportunity to take a tour of the State Technical College of Missouri in Linn, MO.

In March, a group of junior students toured Dieb Enterprises, Inc. in Hillsboro. Dieb Enterprises is a member of the St. Pius X Business Alliance program and representatives met with the students, gave them a tour of the Dieb Enterprises facilities, and conducted a technical career presentation for the students. We look forward to continuing to give our students opportunities to visit four year universities, two year colleges/technical schools, and local industry to explore as many post-secondary options as possible.










SPORTS RECAP



BASEBALL:

As of the time of writing, the St. Pius X Varsity baseball team has a record of 15-9 for the year and has won the 2023 JCAA Conference Championship (Back to Back Conference titles in 2022 & 2023). They have also received the number one seed in the Class 3 District 4 Tournament. This season, the Lancers were led by four seniors: Connor Hamilton, Jordan Sanders, Chase Waterkotte, and Andrew Merseal. Over the past two seasons, the Lancers have won a total of 36 games. The baseball team had the opportunity to play at GCS, a Minor League stadium in Sauget, IL, as well as at Busch Stadium, the home of the St. Louis Cardinals. The baseball coaches would like to express their gratitude to all the parents, players, and administration for their support throughout the season.

TRACK AND FIELD:

The season began with a remarkable start as the girls team emerged victorious as a team in their first meet of the season, the Potosi Invitational on Friday, March 17th. At the Jefferson R7 BlueJay Invitational, the girls secured a 2nd place finish as a team, while the Boys team finished in 5th place. Senior Hanna Burch set a new school record in the Shot Put (11.19m) at the JCAA Conference Meet on April 26th. Freshman Elena Ruble set a new school record in the Javelin (32.71m) at the Potosi Relays on April 18th. Additionally, the Boys 4x400 team, consisting of Freshman Danny DeGeare, Sophomore Sam Eimer, Freshman Braden Caldwell, and Junior John Whitman, set a new school record (3:40.79) at the Class 2 District 1 Track meet on May 6th. On Saturday, May 6, 2023, the St. Pius X Lancers Track and Field teams participated in the Class 2 District 1 meet at Scott City High School. The Lancers qualified for 15 events that will advance to sectionals in New Haven on May 13th. The Girls team also achieved a commendable 3rd place overall in the district, marking the best finish in over three decades.

GIRLS SOCCER:

St. Pius X varsity girls soccer team is currently 17-5-1 and the #2 seed in their Class 2 District. This team has some extremely talented young ladies that have worked hard all season and have a great record to show for it. These ladies have been state ranked in the top 5 of their Class all season long and we are anticipating another district championship with hopes to get back to the Final Four this season. The chemistry of the team is amazing and a joy to coach.











GOLF:

It would be unfair to judge the 2023 edition of the St. Pius X boys golf team solely based on their 4-8 record (4-5 in conference). This season had numerous individual and team highlights. Individually, Will Becker (6) and Chase Waterkotte (3) set 9 new program scoring records. Chase and Will also partnered to win the Windsor Scramble Tournament. Chase, Griffin Baker, and Will earned spots on the JCAA All-Conference Team. Finally, Chase and Will were selected for the Class 2 District 1 All-District Team. As a team, the golfers established 8 new program scoring records and tied the 18-Hole program low of 372 at the Second Annual St. Pius X Invitational held at their home course, Crystal Highlands. To conclude the season, the team secured a second-place finish in the Class 2 District 1 tournament, earning them a spot at the Class 2 State Tournament and making them only the second golf team in St. Pius X history to advance to the state tournament.

BOYS VOLLEYBALL:


