College Prep



At St. Pius X High School, college and career counseling starts freshman year and continues through the application and admissions decision process for seniors. 100% of our graduates move on to post-secondary education, be it career-prep programs, community colleges or four year colleges and universities.

College representatives, recruiters from the armed forces and trade and technical program from across the country visit campus to meet with our students.

683 PROGRAM

The innovative 683 Program started over 15 years ago and is unique to St. Pius X. What is it? 6 trips to 8 different colleges in the student's first 3 years at StPX. It offers students the opportunity to visit universities in a variety of settings - urban, rural, small-town - that come in a variety of sizes, with student populations ranging from 760-9,500 undergraduates.



Visit St. Pius X

Lancer for a Day
